- ♣ Established in 1961.
- ♣ Accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges.
- ♣ Coeducational, Diocesan, College Preparatory.
- ♣ Located on a spacious 42 acre suburban campus in Attleboro, MA, within minutes of Routes 95, 295 and 495.
- ♣ Enrollment is approximately 1,050.
- ♣ Facilities include 62 classrooms, 4 science laboratories, 2 computer classrooms, 4 computer laboratories, band/chorus room, Fine Arts center featuring an art gallery and computer lab, a "state of the art" library and Wi-Fi technology center, an auditorium, gymnasium, weight training rooms, athletic locker facilities, cafeteria, chapel, guidance center, campus ministry center, and administrative offices. The school grounds include athletic facilities for games and practice in football, soccer, baseball, softball, track, tennis and band. The campus includes a Marian shrine and ample parking for students and faculty.
- ♣ Student/Teacher ratio is 1:13 and average class size is 19.
- ♣ Our student body male/female ratio is 1:1.
- ♣ 100% of seniors who apply to college are accepted.
- ♣ The student body attendance rate is 97%.
- ♣ 80% of students participate in an extracurricular activity.

CURRICULUM

- ♣ **Advanced Placement:** Advanced students are offered the opportunity to engage in college level study. Students must demonstrate superior aptitude, achievement, and willingness to commit to considerable independent study. Admission is selective.
- ♣ **Honors 1/Honors:** Courses are designed to challenge students who have demonstrated a high level of academic aptitude and achievement. H1 students experience a rapid pace of instruction, greater depth of topics and more independent work. More time is devoted in the Honors classes to guiding students in the development of critical thinking skills.
- ♣ **College Preparatory 1/College Preparatory:** For students who have demonstrated above average/average aptitude and achievement. Emphasis is placed on developing a strong understanding of the course fundamentals, the capacity for independent and critical thinking and the learning skills necessary for more advanced study. CP level students receive more personal attention and projects are broken down into components.

GRADING

- ♣ Students are graded on a 0 to 100 scale with a grade of 65 as passing.
- ♣ The grading scale follows: A 90–100, B 80–89, C 70–79, D 65–69.
- ♣ Any grade of 64 (failing) or below earns 0.00 credits.
- ♣ Courses are leveled and weighted accordingly.

RESULTS

The success of the school's program of studies can be measured by the number and quality of college acceptances, the amount of scholarship aid for higher education received and National Merit recognition. Our seniors annually receive over \$1.5 million in scholarship, grants, and work study awards. Over the past five years, over 95% of graduates entered four year colleges and 2% entered two year programs.
