Dear Feehan Family,

January 12 marked the one year anniversary of the tragedy in Haiti. For many Haitians, the memory of the earthquake is still too much to bear. Going to church provides some solace to many, and also the rare opportunity to reflect and cry. But these are not the churches they once were. The majority of the churchgoers gather under tents to worship. A year after a 7.0 magnitude earthquake hit Haiti killing about 230,000 people, injuring at least 300,000 and displacing more than 1 million, rebuilding efforts in the capital city have barely begun.



Last year, the Feehan Community generously donated \$10,000.00 to go to help rekindle the flame of education in this devastated area. On March 22, we will present these funds to Father John

Unni. Father John is a priest in the Archdiocese of Boston who has a direct connection to Hearts with Haiti ([www.heartswithhaiti.org](http://www.heartswithhaiti.org)). The Mission of this organization is to provide support to St. Joseph's in Port-au-Prince, Wings of Hope in Fermathe, and Trinity House in Jacmel. Our funds will assist the children as they attempt to bring the normalcy of education back into their lives.

Throughout Lent, we will raise awareness of the continuing plight of Haiti, and we will also raise for funds to help those in need. Please continue to pray for them.

**FROM THE PRESIDENT'S OFFICE**

**MEASURING YOUR CHILD'S LIFE AGAINST YOUR OWN**

I recently heard that David Nelson, the older brother in a 1950's sitcom, "The Adventures of Ozzie and Harriet," passed away. (Does anyone remember the show besides me?) The Nelsons were the perfect American family, and young Dave was a role model for those of us over 50.

The announcement of Dave Nelson's death made me pause and reflect upon an incident that occurred when my oldest son was in high school. Bill got in some trouble for a poor judgment he had made. At the time, I vividly recall saying to my wife, "What was Bill thinking? I would never do that as a student." To which my wife nonchalantly replied, "You were weird."

Although this may sound like a strange response, it was my wife's way of letting me know that it was not right to measure my son's behavior against my own

when I was his age. She was right. I was a middle child from a single parent family and stereotypically I wanted to please my mother ... so I rarely did anything wrong (or at least I can't remember anything) and yes, Dave Nelson was my role model. (No comments please!)



Frequently, when our children do things we disapprove of (neglecting their homework, failing to heed a curfew, getting a speeding ticket, experimenting with alcohol and more) it is normal to question their thought process or lack thereof. We want our children to be successful and avoid mistakes. However, holding a child to a standard that was yours may not always be fair or realistic.

Bob Dylan (does that name ring a bell?) told us years ago, "The times they are a changin'" and he was right. Fifty years ago "hitchhiking" a ride to Feehan from Attleboro or North Attleboro was commonplace. School yard differences were settled with a punch not a gun. Teachers kept kids after school for not doing homework. Families watched "Ozzie and Harriet," and the majority of people went to church on Sundays.

It is understandable to measure our children against our childhood experiences, but over time, with my wife's assistance, I have discovered that kids aren't perfect, and they will react to their environment differently than we did to ours. Does that mean we should lower our expectations? No, but don't appear too shocked when your child makes a mistake—especially one that you never made. The important thing is to help them learn from that mistake and tell them that you still love them... and so too does God.

## FROM MRS. ANN PERRY, VICE PRINCIPAL OF ACADEMIC AFFAIRS

### HAPPY NEW YEAR!

I hope that this New Year brings many joys and blessings to you and your family.

### SCHEDULING FOR 2011–2012

As we turn the calendar to a new year it is also, believe it or not, time to turn towards a new school year. September seems very far away, but now is the time when we begin planning for next year's academic schedule. The scheduling process is designed to give each student the opportunity to make decisions about their four-year academic program. During the process students are encouraged to engage in conversation with parents, guidance counselors, teachers, and department chairs with the goal of designing a challenging, college-preparatory program of study that fits their interests and abilities. I am confident that this process will ensure that the best possible schedule is created for each student.

Last year we had great success with online course selection using *Edline*. Students were able to inform the school of their course and level choices at the beginning of the scheduling process. This led to more accurate and informed decision making as the department chairs, teachers, and guidance counselors were able to view which courses students are interested in as they made their own recommendations. The course selection module in *Edline* will open on January 27 and close on February 7. Students must use their own account to access course selection. It will not be available in the parent account.

By now you should have received, signed, and returned a timetable for the scheduling process. As we move through the scheduling process you will be receiving communications via email with information and instructions about the next steps in the process. These communications will also be reminders about upcoming deadlines. All information regarding the scheduling process will be posted on the school website under Academics>Scheduling 2011-12. It is important to continue to be aware of and respect all deadlines. Timely completion of each step is vital to the process as a whole.

### REMINDER

**Excused Personal Absences or Extended Medical Absences**  
Parents may request approval for these absences by sending a signed note to the Vice Principal of Academics *at least two days in advance of the anticipated absence*. As we approach the end of the year and families begin to make vacation plans, it is important to remember that excused absences are not granted on any of the Final or Advanced Placement examination days. The official end of the school year will not be determined until March because of snow days.

### SECOND QUARTER REPORT CARDS

The second academic quarter ends on January 14, 2011. Report cards will be issued in homeroom on Monday, January 31. A signed copy of the report card must be returned to the homeroom teacher before Thursday, February 3.

### SCIENCE FAIR 2011

Over 200 students will participate in this year's Science Fair on February 2, 2011, from 3:00 to 6:00 p.m. in the Cafeteria. Judges are always needed. Contact [sciencefair@bishopfeehan.com](mailto:sciencefair@bishopfeehan.com) to volunteer or request more information. The Science Fair award ceremony will take place the same evening at 7:30 p.m. in the Auditorium. Attendance is required of all fair participants.

### PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES

Third quarter Parent-Teacher Conferences will take place on Thursday, March 3 from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m. Due to use of the Gymnasium by athletic teams, conferences will take place in the Cafeteria and Classroom Building. Conferences are limited to five minutes. If you need more time with a teacher please contact them to set up an appointment. Although the lines are typically shorter at these spring conferences, we ask your assistance in keeping waiting time to a minimum by politely knocking or moving forward if you have been waiting longer than five minutes.

### ACADEMIC HONOR SOCIETIES INDUCTION

Bishop Feehan High School holds charters for membership in several academic honor societies. The minimum criteria for induction into these societies are listed in the *BFHS Student Handbook* and are generally established by the sponsoring national organization. Invitations to honor society candidates will be issued in February. This year's combined induction for the various academic honor societies will take place on Wednesday, March 23, 2011, at 7:00 p.m., in the Auditorium.

### AWARDS AND RECOGNITIONS

The National Fireside Bible Essay Contest is an opportunity for students to reflect on their Catholic education. Congratulations to **Meghan Casey**, the local winner of the contest. Meghan's essay, "How the Study of Religion has influenced my life" has been submitted on for national judging.

### WINTER DRIVING

Please plan your driving time in the morning to include normal winter delays. We know our parents and students are driving from many different communities and when necessary we will adjust our schedule due to weather concerns. Remind our young drivers to give themselves plenty of time to arrive safe and sound at Feehan.

### LOCKERS

Students are using various instruments to prevent their lockers from being locked so they can easily access their books. Unfortunately, this creates a situation where the belongings of the locker could be taken. Please speak with your child about this. If a student cannot get to class on time, they may need to take more books with them, or develop a different traffic pattern. Please have them seek help in the Student Life Office (Room 212).

### ATTENDANCE

If a student is going to be late or absent, a call to the school must be made. With our young and new drivers involved in winter weather, we want to know our students are safe, and we want to be able to notify you in a timely manner if they have not arrived.

### UNIFORMS

### WINTER SPORTS

### SPRING SPORTS

Tryouts for spring sports begin on March 21, 2011. In order to tryout a student must have a valid certificate of physical fitness to participate. Such certificate expires 13 months from the date of issue. A student loses eligibility after that time, even if it is in the middle of a sports season.

If a student does not have a current certificate through June 15, 2011 an appointment with a medical professional should be scheduled now.

### ACCIDENT INSURANCE

Those students who participate in the optional accident insurance program offered at the school must file a claim within 90 days of any accident or injury. It is highly advisable to file a claim as soon as possible after such injury even if the student's family has other medical insurance. Although the optional accident insurance is supplementary the claim deadline still applies. Do not wait until the primary insurer pays and find out that a balance is not covered due to a late claim filing.

Out of a population of 237 seniors, 219 (92%) have applied to at least one college. 189 acceptances have been received by the seniors who have applied. A total of 1414 applications have been filed with 231 colleges. 24 seniors have made their final choice. Some of the colleges they will be attending are Bryant University, Embry Riddle Aeronautical University, Savannah College of Art and Design, Colgate University, College of the Holy Cross, University of Notre Dame, Franciscan University of Steubenville, Wheeling Jesuit University, Stonehill College, Lee University and Rochester Institute of Technology.

Copies of all 2010 W-2 Wage and Tax Statements for both you and your spouse. NOTE: If you are applying before you have received all 2010 W-2 Wage and Tax Statements, please submit them as soon as they become available to complete the application.

Applications will not be considered "complete" until all required documents are received.

NOTE: Award decisions are not made by FACTS but by Bishop Feehan High School. For all who have complete applications, award notification letters will be mailed by April 15, 2011.
