AP Seminar Course Application

AP Seminar provides students the opportunity to:

- Thoroughly explore different themes while considering diverse perspectives (e.g., cultural and social, artistic and philosophical, political and historical, environmental, economic, and scientific). These themes will be chosen by the students in May.
- Analyze a wide variety of source material to gain a rich appreciation and understanding of issues including: articles; research studies; foundational, literary, and philosophical texts; speeches; broadcasts; personal accounts; artistic works; and performances.
- Work collaboratively with a team to identify, investigate, analyze, and evaluate an academic or real-world problem or issue. Consider options, alternatives, or solutions and develop a multimedia presentation to communicate your conclusion or recommendation.
- Work independently to identify a research question based on provided source material and then
 research that topic. Analyze, evaluate, and select evidence to develop an argument that you will
 present and defend. Finally, produce a multimedia presentation delivered to your classmates.

A successful AP Seminar student:

- is a strong reader and writer. Students will spend about 45 minutes each day reading material or writing responses for homework to prepare for the next day's class.
- has a strong work ethic, an ability to work both independently and in groups, and good critical thinking skills, rather than simple memorization. Team projects and presentations are a major part of this course.
- is prepared to make the commitment to learning new skills in a challenging class.

Unlike other AP courses, this course is comprised of three major components that make up the AP score:
